PARENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Be reasonable in your demands on your racer. Remember, they have other interests.
2. Make sure they attain THEIR goals, not your goals, in their chosen sport.
3. Remember that children ski for fun and enjoyment. Praise their efforts as well as the winning of medals.
4. Encourage fair play and good sportsmanship.
5. Never ridicule other players or judgement of the officials.
6. Teach your player to respect their coaches and other players. Be generous with your praise to other skiers when it is deserved.
7. Never compare your skier to another. Remember that every skier is an individual, and will advance at their own personal rate.
8. Make a personal commitment to keep yourself informed.
9. Co-operate with and respect the Executive of the Association. Remember that they are volunteering their time to help your child enjoy his/her sport.
10. Constructive criticism is always welcome. Petty complaints are not.
11. Help your child be the best he/she can be. Be supportive – to your child, to the coaches, to the team and to the Association.
